

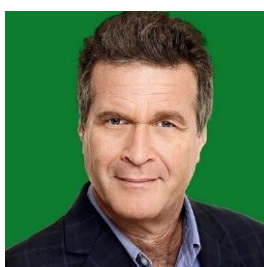

Alfredo Sirkis is Executive Secretary of the Brazilian Forum on Climate Change (FBMC) and Director of the Brazil Climate Center (CBC). Alfredo is an environment and urban manager, journalist, writer and screenwriter. Until the end of 2014 he was a Congressman and chairman of the National Commission on Climate Change (CMMC) and one of the vice presidents of the Committee on Foreign Relations and National Defense of the Chamber of Deputies. He has worked as city councilor, municipal secretary of urbanism and municipal secretary of environment of the city of Rio de Janeiro.



Ana Toni is the Executive Director of Instituto Clima e Sociedade (iCS) and Co-Founder of GIP (Public Interest Management). Ana Toni was the Representative for the Ford Foundation in Brazil, she was Executive Director of ActionAid Brazil and worked for ActionAid UK as Policy Advisor. She worked for Greenpeace and was Board Chair of Greenpeace Brazil and Board Chair of Greenpeace International. Ana was Board member of GIFE (the Brazilian Private Social Investment Association) and Wikimedia Foundation. Currently, she is Board member of Agência Pública, WINGS, Gold Standard Foundation, ITS and of the Baoba Fund for Racial Equity, and integrates the Brazilian Forum of Women's Leaders on Sustainability. Ana graduated in Economic and Social Studies at Swansea University, has a master degree in Politics of the World Economy at the London School of Economics and Political Science and a PhD in Political Science at the Rio de Janeiro State University



André Lucena is an economist from PUC-Rio, with a master and doctoral degree in Energy and Environmental Planning. He was a researcher at the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory in the USA, working on assessing the impacts of climate change on energy infrastructure. He is currently an adjunct professor of the COPPE / UFRJ Energy Planning Program, working on research in the areas of integrated energy planning, energy modeling, global climate change, and energy and environmental economics.



Andrea Lucchesi is PhD in Economics and Quantitative Methods at EACH / USP since 2015. PhD in Economic Sciences at the University of São Paulo in 2013, with a one-year exchange at the University of Birmingham, England. He has experience in higher education in institutions such as Insper and FGV / SP and experience in the financial market and economic consulting. Her main areas of research are quantitative methods focused on topics related to environmental economics and natural resources, public policy evaluation, innovation and labor market. She has articles published in international journals on themes related to forest restoration, energy matrix, carbon tax and conservation areas. She currently works as a researcher on a project funded by the Lemann Foundation in association with Harvard Business School. She is a member of the European Association of Environmental and Resource Economists (EAERE).



Cap.M.G. Fernando Costa is the Coordinator of the Maritime Environment Protection Committee (MEPC) at the Executive Secretariat for IMO Affairs. He was Commander of the Oceanographic Ship "Antares", Superintendent of Meteorology and Oceanography at the Hydrographic Center of the Navy and Captain of Ports in the State of Espírito Santo. He was Defense and Naval Attaché at the Brazilian Embassy in Portugal and Coordinator of the Porto Working Group at the Olympic Public Authority during the preparations for the 2016 Olympic Games. Fernando Costa is a Brazilian Navy Reserve Officer, graduated from the Naval School and specialized in Hydrography and Navigation. He has the General Staff Course for Senior Officers, Maritime Policy and Strategy Course, both by the Naval War School, and an MBA in International Relations from COPPEAD.



Isabelle Rojon is a Consultant at University Maritime Advisory Services (UMAS). Her research focuses on maritime greenhouse gas policies and governance and on climate finance for the shipping industry. Before joining UMAS, she was a Senior Research & Editorial Executive at Fathom Maritime Intelligence, writing publications on environmental regulations and energy efficiency in the maritime industry, and has previously worked in the Energy & Environment Department of the research and consultancy company Ecorys in the Netherlands. Isabelle has a BA in Political and Economic Sciences from RWTH Aachen University, Germany and an MSc in Environmental Policy and Management from Utrecht University, the Netherlands.



Klaus Zillikens is the consul general of Germany in Rio. He holds a degree in Sociology and Historical Science and is a career diplomat. Zillikens has served in several posts abroad, such as Mozambique, Namibia, Austria, Ukraine, Slovenia and Kazakhstan.

Inside the German Foreign Affairs ministry, has served at the Department of Arms Control within the United Nations, at the Southern Africa Division and at the Foreign Trade Division. Before assuming the German General Consulate in Rio de Janeiro, he was Head of the Division of Bilateral Relations with the Nordic and Baltic Countries of Europe, and Baltic and Arctic Sea Policies



Lavinia Hollanda is managing director at Escopo Energia, a boutique energy advisory firm in Brazil. She has a degree in Electrical Engineering from Unicamp and has a PhD in Economics from EPGE/FGV. She has also been Head of Research at the center for energy studies at FGV, where she has written and coordinated several articles and studies on the energy sector. Previously, she worked in the financial market for 10 years, and has also worked on several applied research projects in the energy sector.

Lavinia is currently Vice-Chair of the Board of Directors at Eneva. She was also an external member of the Minority advisory Committee of Petrobras' Board, an external member of the Special Bidding Committee for the 13th Bidding round for exploration areas at ANP, and a member of Royal Dutch Shell's External Review Committee for the Sustainability Report.



Mario Bastos Ferraz de Mendonça is Brazilian Navy Reserve Officer, and had been in active service for more than 30 years, being 13 years of that period on board and exercising functions such as ship's commander. From 2001 to 2010, he served as Advisor at the Executive Secretariat of the Coordination Committee for IMO Affairs, participating at the committees and subcommittees' meetings of the Organization. Since April 2010 he is International, Environmental and Human Resources Advisor of the Union of Brazilian Shipowners - SYNDARMA.



Ricardo César Fernandes is Executive Director of the Brazilian Association of Norwegian Shipowners (ABRAN) and member of the Maritime and Port Law Committee of OAB-RJ. He has extensive experience in activities related to the naval industry, acquired over a 30-year career in the Brazilian Navy. Ricardo is a Captain of Frigate (RM1), holds a degree in Naval Science from Naval School, a Master of Naval Science from Naval War School, an MBA in Business Management from COPPEAD-UFRJ and a Master's degree in Business Administration from EBAPE-FGV.

Charlotte Inglis is the Head of the Maritime and Arctic Programme at the European Climate Foundation (ECF), based in Berlin. While at the ECF Charlotte was also part of the EU and Global Climate Policy teams, which included a focus on international aviation.
